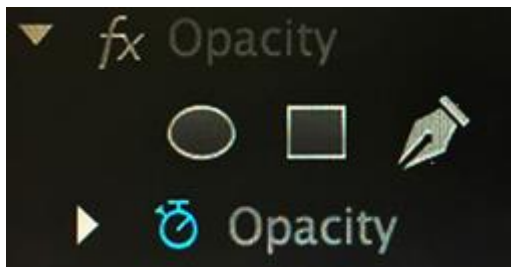

What are the steps to perform this edit?
